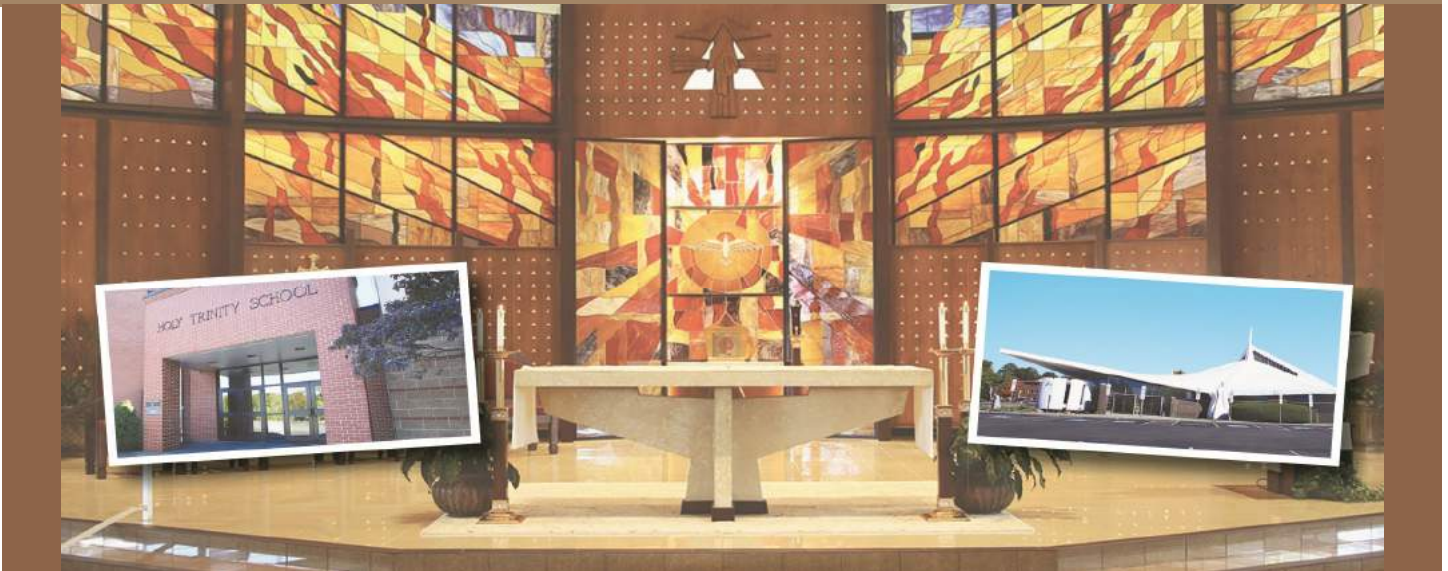

ANOINTING OF THE SICK



One of the seven sacraments of the Church is Anointing of the Sick. This sacrament, along with Confession, is a sacrament of healing. The sacrament, formerly known as Extreme Unction, was reserved for the Catholic taking their last breath. With the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, this sacrament of the dying was changed to a sacrament for the living. Through the laying on of hands and anointing with consecrated oil, the church prays that Christ the healer will come to the aid of those afflicted with illness, the elderly and those who are preparing for surgery. Therefore, the Church encourages her people not to wait until their last breath to be anointed but rather to seek the Sacrament of Anointing when health is declining or sickness is present. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick can be received many times. The clergy of Holy Trinity Parish encourages the elderly, those who are ill to receive this sacrament of healing. To that end, on the weekend of **October 28th and 29th**, the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at ALL Masses. Those who wish to receive this Sacrament are encouraged to register before Mass at the tables in the Narthex of the church and proceed to the front pews. If you are unable to walk to the front pews please take a seat at the end of a pew in the center aisle. If you are unable to attend Mass please call the parish office so that arrangements can be made to schedule the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at your home.

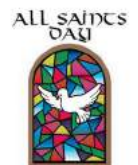

Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve

You will note that the Fourth Sunday of Advent occurs on December 23rd and 24th. Christmas Eve and Day are December 24th and 25th. Therefore, the following guidelines are being published for your edification and planning.

For the 24 hours beginning at 4:00 PM, Saturday, December 23rd through 3:59 PM, Sunday, December 24th all celebrations are for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. For the 32 hours beginning 4:00 PM, Sunday, December 24th through 11:59 PM on Monday, December 25th all celebrations are for the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord.

The following will be the Masses schedule for December 23rd through December 25th. Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 23rd 5:00 pm (Vigil), December 24th: 8:00 am, 10:00 am and 12:00 noon. There will be **no 7:00 pm Mass** on December 24th. Masses for the Christmas Holyday will be: December 24th: 4:00 pm (Vigil Mass of Christmas), 6:30 pm (Vigil Mass of Christmas, 10:00 pm (Christmas Mass at Midnight), December 25th: 9:00 am (Christmas Day Mass) and 11:00 am (Christmas Day Mass. Please note the Masses in parentheses indicate the Mass readings and prayers celebrated at that Mass. **There will be no 7:00 pm Mass on Christmas Day.**
