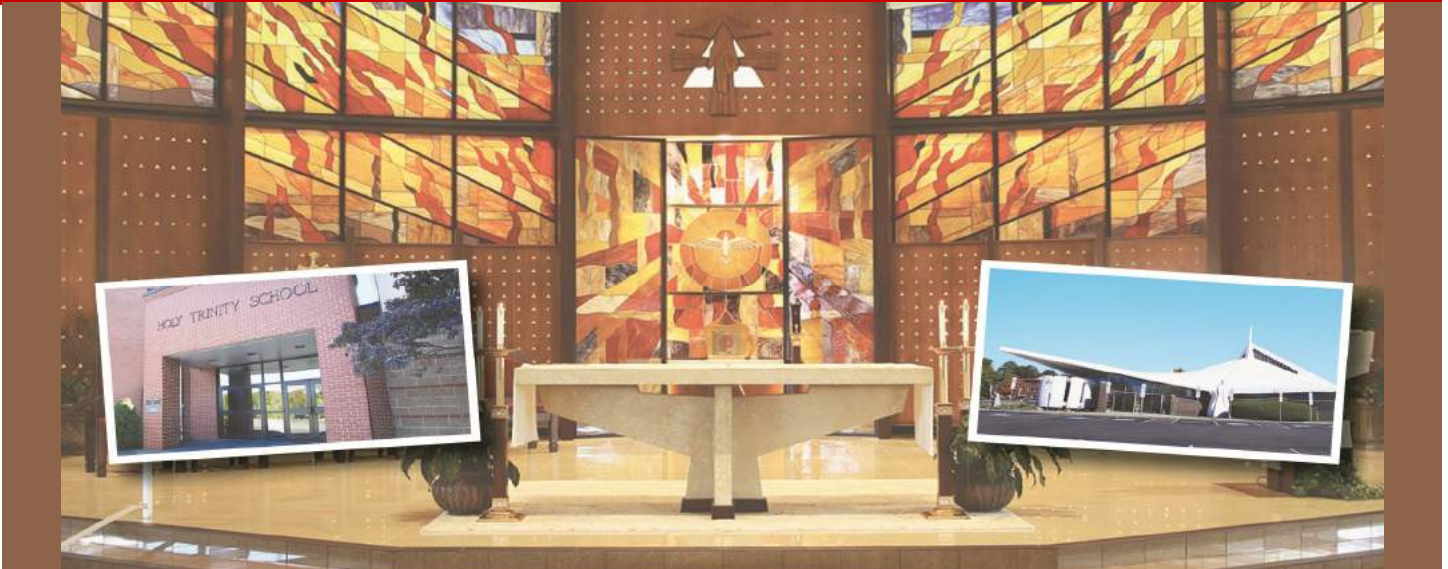

**THE LAMB OF GOD**

“Behold the Lamb of God!” We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there’s a good chance that many Roman Catholics do not know who in the Bible originally spoke it. The phrase appears only in the Gospel of John, on the lips of John the Baptist, who utters it twice. In today’s Gospel reading, John proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God, and two of John’s own disciples then follow Christ. A little bit later Andrew, who heard John and then followed Jesus, brings his brother Simon to be re-named Cephas, or Peter. A careful look at these Bible verses shows us the mission of everyone baptized into the Body of Christ: we must always proclaim our faith in Christ, so that others will follow him. We may not know how the will of God might work through those we bring to Christ; that is not the point. The point is that our ongoing mission as a church is to bring others to Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**

\* Candidates and Sponsors are requested to submit the following documents this time:



**Candidates:** Baptism and First Communion certificates; not required if the candidate was baptized at Holy Trinity.

**Sponsors:** Letter of Eligibility, to be a sponsor, from the parish in which she or he is registered; not required if the sponsor is a member of Holy Trinity.

**Qualifications to be a Sponsor:**

- Fully initiated into the church; Baptized, received First Communion, and Confirmed.
- Over the age of sixteen.
- Member in good standing in their parish as determined by the Letter of Eligibility from the parish of membership; primarily to attend Mass each week and receive the sacraments according to Church teaching; especially Reconciliation and Eucharist, and live a moral life.
- If married, the marriage was to have taken place in the Catholic Church and must currently be living a valid marriage.
- The sponsor does not have to be same gender of the candidate.
- Parents are not permitted to be sponsors. All other family members, in good standing with the Church, may be sponsors.

**-Note:** The sponsor should take some time to meet with their candidate and have the intention to accept this role responsibly.

A **Godparent** is an excellent choice and helps to emphasize the connection between Baptism and Confirmation.

The **RETREAT** will take place on Saturday, February 24, 2018 at Holy Trinity beginning at 10:00AM and concluding with the 5:00PM Vigil Mass for Sunday.

Due to the support that each gives the candidate, the sponsor (preferred) or a parent/guardian is requested to attend the RETREAT.

### A BRIEF SKETCH OF THE GOSPEL OF MARK

As we enter Ordinary Time of the church Year we will be reading from cycle B of the Lectionary and the Gospel according to Mark. Perhaps a brief introduction to the gospel will help us. The following is an outline presented by Dr. Brant Pitre,

Mark is THE Second Gospel and in lists of canonical books; Mark is ordinarily second. It is the shortest Gospel: Mark (16 chs.); Matthew (28 chs.); Luke (24 chs.); John (21 chs.) It might be called the Common Gospel since over 95% of stories in Mark also found in Matthew. Only found in Mark is: a. Blind man of Bethsaida (Mark 8:24) and b. Naked "young man" in Gethsemane (Mark 14:51). Some say it is the least 'Popular' Gospel because: a. It is relatively neglected by ancient & medieval commentators b. Contains no account of the Infancy of Jesus (cf. Matthew and Luke) 5. There is some thought of Markan 'Priority', i.e., turns from '2nd Gospel' to '1st Gospel'!

#### The Gospel of Mark in the Early Church:

1. Universally attributed to John Mark: a. John Mark: son of Mary, resident of Jerusalem (Acts 12:12-14, 25); b. Mark was a companion of Paul (Philem 23-24; 2 Tim 4:11); c. A disciple of Peter (1 Pet 5:12-13); d. And a Jewish Christian: member of "circumcision" (Col 4:10-11); e. He did get into an argument with Paul! (Acts 15:36-40)
2. Papias of Hierapolis: And the elder [John] used to say this: "Mark, having become Peter's interpreter, wrote down accurately everything he remembered, though not in order, of the things either said or done by Christ. For he neither heard the Lord nor followed him, but afterward, as I said, followed Peter, who adapted his teachings as needed but had no intention of giving an ordered account of the Lord's sayings. Consequently, Mark did nothing wrong in writing down some things as he remembered them, for he made it his one concern not to omit anything that he heard or make any false statement in them." (Papias of Hierapolis, cited in Eusebius, Church History, 3.39.15; trans. M. W. Holmes, 2007)
2. Irenaeus of Lyons: "Mark the disciple and interpreter of Peter" (see Eusebius, Church History, 5.8.3)
3. Clement of Alexandria: the gospel was written by Mark "Peter's follower" during the "reign of Claudius"; was "ratified" by Peter for "study in the churches" (see Eusebius, Church History 2.14-15)
4. Origen of Alexandria: after Matthew, Mark was written "Secondly"; done "in accordance with Peter's instructions"; he is mentioned by Peter in 1 Peter 5:13 (see Eusebius, Church History, 6.25.4-5)
5. Jerome: The gospel is written by Peter's "disciple and interpreter"; Peter both "heard it" and "approved it"; Mark "went to Egypt" and "formed a church" at Alexandria (Jerome, Lives of Illustrious Men, 1.4)
6. Anonymous Latin Prologue: Mark was called "stumpy-fingers"; he was Peter's "interpreter"; he wrote the

Gospel after Peter's death (trans. C. Clifton Black, Mark, 119)

#### The Gospel of Mark in Contemporary Scholarship:

1. Authorship of Mark's Gospel: a. Unknown: anonymous Gospel theory; ignorance of Jewish laws (Mark 7:1-4); b. Peter's Disciple: very Jewish; very Petrine; unanimous external evidence
2. Date of Mark's Gospel: a. ca./post 70 A.D.: Jesus' prophecy of Jerusalem Temple (Mark 13:1-27); b. pre-62 A.D.: Luke-Acts dependent on Mark's Gospel (cf. Luke 1:1-4); c. External Evidence: Mark died around 62 A.D. in Alexandria (Eusebius)
3. Setting of Mark's Gospel: a. Galilee: lots of focus on Galilee; b. Syria: flight from Jerusalem (cf. Mark 13:14) refers to Mark's church; c. Rome: use of Latin terms (Mark 15:16, 21)

#### Key Themes in the Gospel of Mark:

1. 'Action-Packed' Gospel: Jesus the exorcist/healer is always doing something: a. Parables Discourse (Mark 4:1-32); b. Olivet Discourse (Mark 13:1-37); c. Otherwise, mostly miracles; d. Rapid Pace: "and immediately" (Greek euthys) (over 40X!) (Mark 1:10, etc.)
2. Secret of Jesus' Messianic and Divine Identity: a. "Mystery" of the Kingdom (Mark 4:1-12); b. "Messianic Secret" (Mark 1:24-25, 34; 3:12; 5:43; 7:36; 8:26-27, 30; 9:9); c. Divine "Son of God" (Mark 1:1, 11; 14:61-62).

#### The Contents of Mark: Year B:

1. The Baptism of Jesus (Mark 1) (1st Sunday)
2. Jesus' Ministry in Galilee (Mark 2-6) (2nd-16th Sundays)
3. Feeding of the 5000 and Bread of Life Discourse (John 6) (17th- 21st Sundays)
4. Jesus' Ministry in Galilee Continued (Mark 7-9) (22nd-26th Sundays)
5. Jesus' Ministry in Judea (Mark 10-13) (27th-33rd Sundays)
6. Christ the King (John 18) (34th Sunday)

N.B. Since Mark is the shortest Gospel there is not enough content to fill all the Sundays, thus the Feeding of the 5,000 and the Bread of Life Discourse from the Gospel of John are used to complete the cycle.
